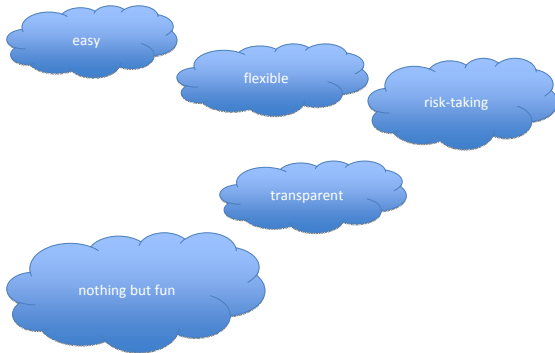
- Next steps by the EU COM:

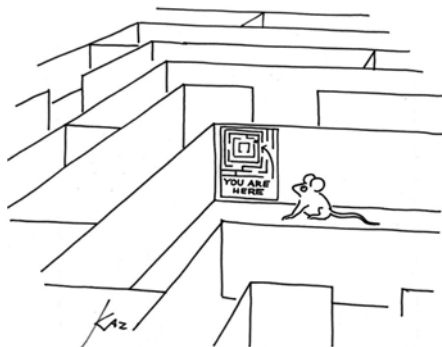


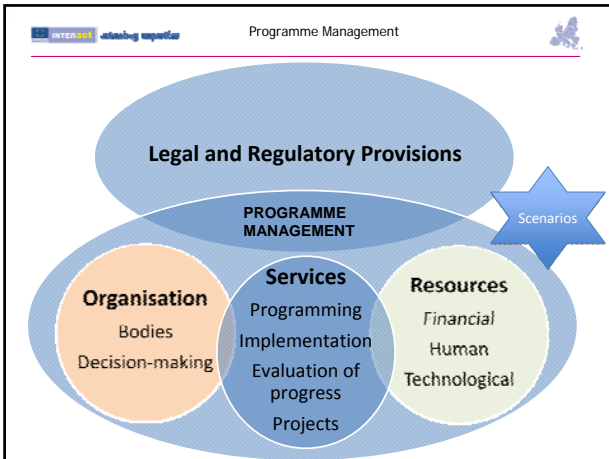

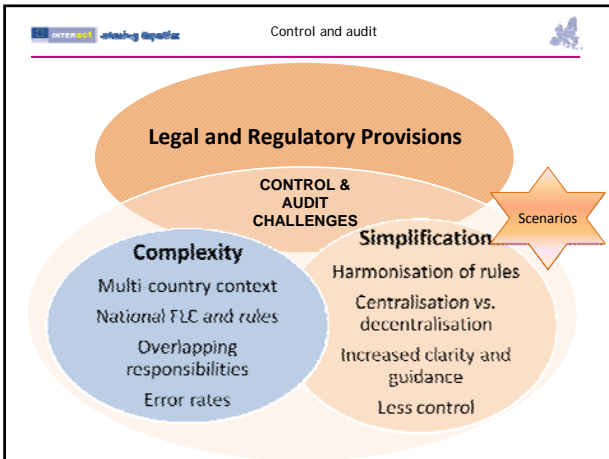
- ETC-Experts to help us in drafting a paper on:
