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


Where do you plan to use the draft budget method?



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

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



Programme- vs project-specific

Programme-specific SCOs


Project-specific SCOs

- Used by all projects;
- there is historical data/ other data sources for the MA/ JS to develop these SCOs;
 - replication (from project to project).

- Cannot be (automatically) reused for other projects;
- cover specific nitty-gritty activities/ costs;
- no replication (programme-specific SCOs can be developed by the programme once there is enough historical data from draft budget proposals – uplifted to "programme-specific SCOs").

A draft budget method


SCOs are established for project implementation (subsidy contract with SCOs) - "project-specific" SCOs (simplified implementation)



numerous activities, where off-the-shelf/ programme-specific SCOs cannot be used

Most popular SCO – lump sum; several lump sums to reduce risks (milestones); unit costs and flat rates are also possible.

Off-the-shelf/ programme-specific SCOs in the draft budget method



Points of attention - draft budget method

Method to establish an SCO(s)	The objective of the method is to establish an SCO(s).		
The most effort- consuming method	Due to ex-ante work (assessment guide with a focus on equal treatment, cost benchmarks/ reference points, case-by-case assessment, transformation to SCO(s), defining milestones/ payment triggers), extensive documentation, individuality.		
Threshold	Up to EUR 200 000 total costs (in the framework of an SPF (Article 25 of the Interreg Regulation) – up to EUR 100 000 total costs).		
Advantages	Allows for innovative project ideas; relatively easy implementation phase; flexibility for projects; simplification; hiding small items into an SCO(s).

Assesment & transformation into SCOs



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A draft budget method

A calculation method to establish a projectspecific SCO(s).

Applicant submits a draft budget to the programme (with real costs; proper documentation).

Programme can include SCOs in the draft budget method (e.g., 15% for office and admin) Programme assesses the draft budget proposal (case-by-case basis).

Programme transforms proposal into an SCO(s) – in grant agreement:

 establishing milestones to be delivered and payment triggers. SCOs are used during the project implementation:

- expenditure is reimbursed according to payment triggers;
- control and audit of SCOs and not of initial amounts used in the draft budget proposal.

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Milestones in the draft budget method

- Focus on activities that make up the payment.
- Milestones are not always needed (if the implementation is short and the output is clear).





Draft budget method - example

Budget item	Cost*	SCO	Approach
Kick-off meeting	5,000		
Data collection	10,000	Lump sum 1 = 20,000	Milestone 1 – delivery of the report X
Report preparation	5,000		
Marketing campaign design	5,000		
Marketing campaign execution	20,000		Milestone 2 – execution of marketing campaign and evaluation study
Evaluation study	5,000	Lump sum 2 = 43,000	
Staff (20%)	10,000		
Office and admin (15%)	1,500		
Travel and accommodation (15%)	1,500		
Total	63,000	63,000


