INTERREG 2021-2027

Context: fast changing circumstances

CARE (adopted 6/4) and FAST CARE (proposal)

- Increased impact of flows of persons fleeing Ukraine, including on Member States' budgets
- I.a. additional flexibility for amendment OP's, extra options for 100% co-financing (especially for measures addressing migratory challenges), additional flexibility between the funds
- CPR's 2014-2020 and 2021-2027 are covered

REPOWER EU (proposal)

- Objective: accelerate energy transition and make EU less dependent on external energy sources
- Mini-omnibus proposal modifying 5 separate items of legislation
- The CPR to allow transfers from CPR Funds to REPowerEU



State of progress negotiations mainstream

Out of 27 Partnership Agreements:

- 23 PA's formally submitted (missing are HR, MT, IE and SI)
- 10 PA's adopted: AT, CZ, EL, FI, FR, DE, DK, LT, NL and SE
- Probably all PAs except for HR, MT and ES will be adopted by September

Out of 293 cohesion policy IJG programmes:

- 221 were formally submitted
- 26 programmes were adopted (18 DE, 4 EL, 3 CZ and 1 FI)



State of negotiations INTERREG



State of progress negotiations Interreg

- Total number of programmes: 96 (87 without OP's with RU/BLR)
 - 77 formally submitted
 - Observations were sent to almost all submitted programmes
 - 17 OP's adopted
 - 13 Strand A CBC programmes: AT-DE, DE/BY-CZ, FR-CH, Upper Rhine (FR/DE/CH), DE-NL, DE-DK, SI-AT, Aurora (SE/FI/NO), Central Baltic (FI/EE/LV/SE), IT-AT, AT-CZ, Alcotra (IT/FR), ABH (DE/AT/CH/FL)
 - 4 Strand B TN programmes: Central Europe, Alpine Space, EuroMed, Baltic Space
 - Due to Russia's attack on Ukraine, the Multiannual Strategy Document (MSD) for Interreg NEXT had to be updated and was presented to the CPR committee on 1 June 2022, with adoption expected before the summer break

- Mainstream programmes: sufficient attention for embedding, where relevant: Interact

The challenge in implementation

Good initiative to make concrete steps:

- Suggested text to be integrated in the Interreg programme template on multiprogramme coordination mechanism
- Bottom up approach and taking ownership
- Added value should be clear for all programmes
- Welcome effort for better use of capitalisation
- Pragmatic approach: no complex procedures
- If additional financing is required: TA or ISO1

New calls to come

The Objective of this presentation is to inform on the next Interreg calls for 2022 and 2023, based on the specific objectives and other key information. Full information are available here.





Expected calls from spring 2022 to fall 2023



To be noted, data are not stable or exhaustive, based on estimation. Some programme was not ready to define time slots, the selected SO that will be considered by the specific calls or other details.





A pick is expected between autumn 2022 and spring 2023 2022



The period between Autumn 2022 and Spring 2023 is the pick of the launch for many calls, and the list is probably not exhaustive. Each season sees 8, 9 calls launched simultaneously.





Autumn 2022



Already in autumn 2022, 9 programmes are expected to launch calls, covering 12 specific objectives. Some of them, as Culture and Tourism (SO 4.6) or Climate change and risk reduction (SO 2.4) are covered by the majority of the Interreg Mediterranean programmes.




Winter 2023



In winter 2023, again, 9 programmes are expected to launch 9 new calls, covering 15 specific objectives. Culture and Tourism (SO 4.6) and **Biodiverity and Nature** protection (SO 2.7) are the most covered by the majority of the Interreg Mediterranean programmes.








Spring 2023 sees also 8 programmes launching 8 new calls, with the Interreg NEXT programmes stepping on the ground. Culture and Tourism (SO 4.6) remains the most covered specific objective, followed by, again, Climate change and risk reduction (SO 2.4). So far, no calls are expected to be launched in summer 2023, unless some slip of calls expected on spring 2023

Portal basics: Personalised services

Personalised access to the Funding & Tenders Portal is based on 3 elements:

- Each user is supposed to have a unique EU Login account, which is the unique identifier for persons.
- 2. Each EU Login account is linked to one (or more) **PIC number**(s), which are the **unique identifier for organisations**.
- 3. Each EU Login account is linked to all the **roles** that the user has in projects and/or organisations through IAM.


























Portal basics: EU Login

- Based on the "single sign-on" principle:
 1 EU Login account = 1 (professional) e-mail address = 1 person
- Do not share your EU Login credentials
- Avoid functional mailboxes
- Add another layer of protection by enabling the 2-factor authentication

Portal basics: PIC

- Every organisation taking part in a proposal must have a PIC
- Registering an organisation requires an EU Login account
- The person who registers an organisation receives the Self-Registrant role: this person is the contact person with the Commission services for this organisation until a LEAR is appointed
- When the registration is completed, the PIC is provisional ("declared"), meaning that the submitted data then needs to be validated
- You can look for existing PICs using the PIC search







3. Partner Search

What it is and how to use it



The Partner Search

- It aims at facilitating the meeting of organisations looking for partners to apply for EU funding
- You can look for partners in the context of a given call/topic or on a more general field
- You can specifically look for organisations or persons



Searching for partners for a specific call/topic

- A partner search announcement can be:
 - □ an "expertise offer" (you are offering your expertise to form a new consortium or join an existing consortium)
 - □ an "expertise request" (you are missing a specific expertise and are looking for someone to provide this)
- Only the LEAR / Account Administrators / Self-registrant can post partner search requests for organisations
- To publish partner search requests for persons, all you need is a published person profile

The Organisation profile


- The Organisation profile gathers publicly available information about organisations registered in the Funding & Tenders Portal Participant Register

 - □ the LEAR and Account Administrators for other cases





6. What about privacy?

Can I be sure that sensitive data is not disclosed?



Is my data available for all to see?

- Organisation-related data is only information which is publicly available.
- Person profiles are not published by default.
 Personal data is never disclosed until you explicitly give your consent about what can be shown publicly; the rest remains hidden.



What about spam/phishing?

- No personal data (name, email address) is disclosed through the contact forms
- Mandatory captcha to minimise risks of abuse through bots
- Using the contact forms is subject to the Terms & Conditions of use of the F&T Portal; any abuse may lead to sanctions.
- Background checks are run by our teams to limit the risk of abuse.








Competitiveness and resiliency of the contemporary visual art today depends on the capacities of cultural operators to use opportunities of new technologies and innovative working practices, in order to join global market and reach and engage with new and wider audience. This is exactly what BITE of Art 2.0 will offer, aiming to increase competitiveness and contribute to the economic sustainability of the European cultural operators active in the field of socially engaged contemporary visual art, through development, dissemination and application of the freeware business model BITE CABM 2.0 which is based on innovative and digital management and marketing practices, for reshaping the way they work and developing new and socially and politically engaged young audience. Using cross-sectoral and trans-national synergy of experiences and expertise of 6 partners from 4 countries, we will develop BITE Contemporary Art Business Model 2.0 which will contain: 1) approaches for innovating programs of cultural operators through new technologies, allowing them to explore and exploit potential of digital and open spaces; 2)know-how for opening and running blockchain-based Virtual galleries on the global market, widening its outreach; and 3) communication strategy based on content marketing approach for supporting audience building efforts of first 2 features. Other key activities are focused on enhancing capacities of 16 cultural operators based on BITE CABM 2.0 and its integration into their work, as well as its application on 4 socially engaged contemporary visual art events in 4 participating cities (including BITE festival in Ljubljana for young emerging artists where BITE Art Tour will be applied), reaching and engaging at least 10000 socially and politically passive young people. These activities will be supported through extensive communication strategy reaching at least 660,000 young people, and later disseminated toward at least 55000 cultural operators all over Europe








Horizon Europe (2021-2027): structure





Horizon Europe budget





Functions of Executive Agencies

Executive Agencies support one or several Commission departments by implementing EU programmes that contribute to the achievement of EU strategic objectives.

They are entrusted the following tasks:

- > Launching calls for proposals,
- > ensuring the evaluation of the proposals received,
- > supporting the choice of the proposals made by the Commission,
- > monitoring the projects,
- executing the payments and
- > provide feedback to the Commission on the results of the projects



Functions of the National Contact Points

Support structures for the implementation of the FP in Member States, Associated countries and Third countries:

- Ensuring that the programme becomes known and readily accessible to all potential applicants.
- Providing information and on-the ground advice to potential applicants and beneficiaries.
- Facilitating networking among applicants from different countries, thanks to the networking among NCPs, (such as NCP Academy in Horizon 2020).


International Cooperation modalities: Targeted topics and coordinated calls

- > Targeted topics in calls for proposals may:
 - indicate that participation of International Partners is encouraged;
 - indicate that participation of partners from a certain country or region is encouraged or even mandatory.
- Coordinated calls with a specific country are used for specific actions whereby the partner country also issues a national call for proposals to fund national organisations engaging with Europeans. The evaluation and selection is carried out jointly.

The cooperation in the region underlines the importance of common solutions to address major challenges, such as skills mismatch, youth unemployment and brain drain.

The **New Agenda for the Mediterranean** sets out clear objectives for the years to come to build fairer, more prosperous and inclusive societies for the benefit of people, especially the youth, where Research & Innovation is crucial for sustainable development.

In addition the **EU's Global Approach to Research & Innovation** prioritizes the Mediterranean as one of its regions for cooperation.

Union for the Mediterranean Regional Platform in R&I

The EU and the Mediterranean region are engaged in a very active policy dialogue in the context of the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) Regional Platform in Research and Innovation (R&I), which brings together 42 member states (27 EU Member States and 15 third Countries)

What's new after the UfM R&I Ministerial declaration of 27 June 2022:

- Acknowledging the R&I Roadmaps on the three agreed priorities areas as a catalyser for future cooperation;
- Transform these jointly agreed political priorities into specific actions, committing to mobilising resources from national and EU level programmes, namely:
 - Support from Horizon Europe towards implementing the UfM R&I Roadmaps on Health, Climate change and Renewable Energy;
 - Ensuring the rolling out of the Partnership for Research and Innovation in the Mediterranean Area and other cooperation initiatives including the implementation and deployment of Mission "Restore our Ocean and Waters by 2030" and the BLUEMED Initiative



Association to Horizon Europe

- The EU has **bilateral agreements** with individual countries around the region, aiming to increase cooperation in research and innovation (Algeria, Egypt, Jordan and Morocco).
- Israel, Turkey and Tunisia are **associated to Horizon Europe**. Morocco association negotiations are ongoing and Egypt has expressed its interest to become associated to Horizon Europe.

Overview of PRIMA - Partnership on Research & Innovation in the Med Area

- A ten-year initiative (2018-2028), funded by EU's Horizon 2020
- 19 Partner countries: Algeria, Croatia, Cyprus, Egypt, France, Germany, Greece, Israel, Italy, Jordan, Lebanon, Luxembourg, Malta, Morocco, Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, Tunisia and Turkey
- Funding from partner countries, currently €274 million, and a €220 million contribution from the EU through Horizon 2020
- PRIMA launches yearly calls for proposals to mobilise the Euro-Med scientific communities, stakeholders and public and private entities to identify R&I solutions for more sustainable water and agri-food systems management.





R&I cooperation is an effective tool to **strengthen Med regional integration**, to build bridges across countries. Generating new knowledge and devise solutions allows to better address **common environmental**, **social and economic challenges**, which no country, alone, can address.

Common features & differences between PRIMA & Interreg Calls in the Med



- Similar area: 14 countries, out of 15, of Interreg Next Med are represented in PRIMA, except Palestine, with 5 additional ones, Croatia, Germany, Luxembourg, Slovenia, & Morocco.
- PRIMA and Interreg share the principles of co-ownership and co-decision, mutual trust between the countries from both shores of the Med.







Dashboard Thematic area – Funded Projects (2018-2021)








