


### State of progress negotiations

- Total number of Programmes: 96
- 73 programmes under Strand A (Interreg VI-A) cross border cooperation (CBC):
  - 48 on internal borders
  - Peace Plus
  - 10 IPA CBC
  - 14 NEXT CBC (of which 9 with RU or BY programming currently suspended)
- 14 programmes under Strand B (Interreg VI-B) trans-national (TN) cooperation
- 4 under Strand C (interregional) (Interreg VI-C)
- - 5 under Strand D (outermost regions) (OR) (Interreg VI-D)

# Complementarities and synergies in Mediterranean



#### The challenge in implementation

- Several maritime territories reflected on their needs and built a solid intervention logic
- The identified links to sea basin and macro-regional strategies will soon need to be tangible in implementation
- Strong coordination between maritime CBC (strand A) and transnational (strand B) required, especially for the same programmed SOs



#### The challenge in implementation

#### **Good initiative to make concrete steps:**

- Suggested text to be integrated in the Interreg programme template on multiprogramme coordination mechanism
- Bottom up approach and taking ownership
- Added value should be clear for all programmes
- Welcome effort for better use of capitalisation
- Pragmatic approach: no complex procedures
- If additional financing is required: TA or ISO1



# TESIM technical support to the important per lattion of programmes on the selected specific objectives

- 1 is perfect correlation, 0 is no correlation, -1 is perfect negative correlation = exactly opposite choices
- Correlation score = sum of correlations with all other programmes
- Greece Albania and Italy Malta have highest correlations scores.
   → most similarities with other programmes in terms of their SOs
- Correlation scores IPA programmes are higher than NEXT and Internal
- Correlation scores CBC programmes higher than Transnational prgs.
- Interreg programmes are most diverse in terms of SO selection
- High correlation between Internal and IPA
- Lower correlation transnational than CBC programmes

This is Pearson's correlation coefficient. The x are the SOs of one programme (0 for each unselected SO and 1 for each selected SO), the y are the SOs of the other programme.  $\sum x$  means the sum of all x scores and  $\sum y$  the sum of all y scores.  $\sum xy$  means the sum of the products of each SO score for the two programmes (1 if both selected). 0 if not both selected).





## Arctic Cooperation



A cross-programme collaboration between European cooperation programmes in the Arctic













- Mandated by the Joint Communication "A new integrated EU policy for the Arctic" from 2016
- NPA coordinates the network
- Common approach:
  - Benefiting people who actual live there
  - Sustainable use of natural resources
  - Arctic entrepreneurial spirit
  - Utilising cold climate expertise
  - Overcoming critical mass







#### What have we achieved together?

- Roadmap for Cooperation
- Joint communication and promotional activities
- Coordination during assessment of applications
- Clustering of projects from multiple programmes
- Joint workshops, Arctic themed conferences, high-level presentations
- Arctic Award project competition
- Regular exchanges in preparation for 2021-2027



#### What did the cooperation require?

- Common interest sustainable regional development in the Arctic
- Similar themes and geography—but each programme with own approach
- Flexible structure cooperation based on openness, good will, and trust
- Pragmatic approach joint activities stayed within the remit of programme administrations (not policy makers)
- No dedicated resources mostly staff time, travel costs, and approx. 10-15.000 EUR/programme for larger events, often back-to-back with regular programme events



## Arctic Cooperation

#### **Impacts**

- Raised profile of Arctic regional development issues towards (EU) decision makers
- More efficient programme management, and better programme preparation
- Better informed project selection
- Higher visibility of results, e.g. through the Arctic Awards
- More synergies and greater reach through clustering projects
- Good value for money soft cooperation based on goodwill and few resources

#### **Looking forward**

- Creating more cooperation opportunities for stakeholders (regions, universities) to make better use of synergies
- Widening the outreach towards other Arctic networks, and possibly mainstream programmes
- Better involvement of national and regional representatives
- More visibility and joint communication/promotion
- Addressing the new EU Joint Arctic Communication 2021
- Coordination from start to finish

#### **Conclusions & Recommendations**

#### Cross-programme collaboration...

...is absolutely worth the effort for programmes, even without dedicated resources

...brings a lot of added value for stakeholders ...is not normal/self evident, but cooperation is a skill everyone can learn

#### **Recommendations:**

- Start simple, take your time before trying more ambitious activities
- Keep it flexible (soft cooperation)
- Share the burden
- Agree on what you are (not), and keep it close to core skills

Feedback on synergies and complementarities under 2014-2020 Programming period

#### **ENI CBC MED SYNERGIES AND COORDINATION IN 2014-2020**

- Special relation with UFM: Memorandum of Understanding with UFM signed on 10 April 2019 to enhance cooperation, exchange information, participate in mutual activities
  - 4 thematic clusters of ENI CBC Med projects labelled by Union for the Mediterranean's Senior Officials on 18 December 2019
- Enhance the role of ENI CBC Med as initiative contributing to EU bilateral relations with partner countries: funded projects asked to invite local EU delegations for major events
- Call for capitalisation projects: a pioneering initiative to foster 'operational' synergies and complementarities:
  - ToRs of the call based on the integration of results from Interreg and ENI CBC programmes, WestMED and BlueMed initiatiaves, the PRIMA programme, initiatives supported by international donors or by the EU under the regional and bilateral components of the European Neighbourhood Policy
  - > Structured dialogue with managing bodies of UfM and Interreg Med to identify valuable projects and their outputs

### **INTERREG MED: CAPITALIZATION IN 2014-2020**

- Thematic communities (one per each Programme objective) leaded by so called horizontal projects (HP: community building projects).
  - Possibility for all thematic/territorial projects to **be** part of a same group/cluster coordinated by a HP in order to exchange, promote, transfer and achieve new common shared outputs internally and externally.
  - Advantages: implementation along the projects duration without waiting until their end avoiding the risk of quick depreciation of results.
  - The **definition of criteria** and methodologies by the thematic communities themselves
  - Management of **communication** and **exchange** of **information** or **results** towards the national institutions and strategic projects involved in the "governance" axis of the programme **to reach** a better **impact** to key **stakeholders** and **decision makers**.



### ITALY – FRANCE Maritime CAPITALIZATION IN 2014-2020

- Creation of six "thematic clusters" and the inclusion of each financed project in one
  of these clusters and secondly on the organization of thematic "living labs" involving
  beneficiaries lead to the identification of integrated outputs and synergies among
  projects results supported by a continuous desk analysis of the projects outputs.
- Main added value of this approach:
  - > A rising up of the **cooperation** between **projects** leading to new developments;
  - An identification of the projects having a **high potential of sustainability** and **replicability**.
  - For each thematic cluster, a few projects results chosen as flagship achievements and their most relevant outcomes gathered in a "Catalogue of good practices" published and disseminated through a communication campaign.

### **Boosting coordination and synergies**

### Main challenges:

- To structure the coordination with other Programmes and initiatives to gather the best results achieved by their projects
- To maximise the impact of the INTERREG NEXT MED Programme in the territories of the participating countries through our capitalization experience
- To promote the synergies among different actors working on the same thematic objectives



### The pilot initiative with other Interreg Programmes

### **Main objectives:**

- Reinforcing the policy contribution of each single Programme by improving the quality and richness of the existing knowledge related to a specific topic.
- Enhancing the impact of innovative solutions tested at local level, by creating a value chain among projects, thus fostering processes of transfering, scaling-up and mainstreaming.

**Programmes willing to adhere** (open to other **Programmes**/initiatives):

- INTERREG NEXT MED
- EUROMED
- INTERREG Italy- France (Maritime)

Actors involved: MC, Interact/Tesim/ other Initiatives

Proposed topic: sustainable tourism



# Why a pilot multi-programme initiative?

- Each programme will contribute through its previous capitalization experience (thematic projects, clusters etc.)
- Need to set up a punctual exchange to avoid overlaps and maximise the re-use of the best results in different geographical areas of the Mediterranean Sea Basin

• **Enlarging** the possibilities to <u>implement best project</u> outputs in the Mediterranean countries



### How it would work

 Technical working group (JSs, MAs) in charge of the implementing and monitoring of the multi-programmes coordination mechanism.

The WG will prepare a **strategy** and the **annual working plan** to be approved by Monitoring Committee.

### Main tasks:

- Identification of the common stakeholders (targets),
- setting up of the technical cooperation tools and criteria of assessment,
- c. definition of common project and programme actions (including a joint communication plan).



### Main steps and outcomes

Phase 1
Identification

- •Screening of the promising/best results achieved and selection according to common criteria
- •Outcome: selection of best programmes results/outputs to be used jointly in the Mediterranean area.

Phase 2
Consultation

- Sharing of the best selected programmes results with other initiatives and strategies (UfM, Westmed) programme/project actors MC, Beneficiaries
- Outcome: common seminars, videos, catalogues on best programmes results/outputs

Phase 3
Consolidation

- Transfer of identified best joint results towards shared stakeholders:
- Outcome: a final new proposal for a pilot joint activity of a common cross cutting capitalization as its direct outcome

Phase 4
mplementatio

- Setting up common tools: joint living labs; peer reviews; joint ToRs for call for proposals
- Outcome: new partners/stakeholder's networks/forum reached

Phase 5
Dissemination

- disseminate the results of the coordination mechanism through common communication activities
- **Outcome**: communication tools to **disseminate** reinforced policy recommendations and actions based on the tested innovative solutions



### **Proposed timeline**

#### 2022

- Presentation of the coordination mechanism for validation by TFs (validated!) March>

April > - Presentation of the coordination mechanism to all other Interreg programmes (MED-LAB group (Interact-TESIM)

- Setting up governance system fixing objectives, actions and timeline for the year as well May > as the exact scope/perimeter of the topic investigated

- Analysis and selection of 2014/20 best results/solutions by each programme following June > the fixed common criteria

July / Dec. > - Homogenization of results, building common tools to show/publish/spread out them

Nov. / Dec. > - Assessment of operations, networking, enlargement of the partnership.

#### 2023

Jan. / June > Consolidation of the enlargement partnership, integration of 2014/20 results of new volunteer associated programmes (and former ones if needed), designing of common objectives and tools related to the 2021/27 programming period based on 2022 experience and assessment, planning of coordination activities for the second semester.

# **Breakout Room I discussion**

- Most of the programmes fall under the EUSAIR strategy and flagship priorities. Coordination
  with internal inner maritime CBC programme was raised while connecting the different CBC
  programmes and focusing on multiprogramme coordination mechanism. TA funds under some
  programmes will be used to support synergies.
- Thematic drivers: Flasgships not yet finalized, however some of the thematic topics identified are: Tourism, maritime transport, resilience, more connectivity, smart and competitive, good governance, accessibility.
- Way forward:
- Doubling the level of coordination starting from capitalization and through capitalization
- Capitalizing on the results of the programmes
- Developing tools and capacities (namely of young people) through research and specialized education
- Further developing synergies with Horizon
- Identifying the tools needed to implement interprogramme coordination activities





# **Breakout Room II discussion**

- The group had a larger focus on complementarities to the WestMed initiative and the multiprogramme coordination mechanism, incl., for example, possibilities to join the mechanism activities (living labs, clusters) beyond programmes directly involved in the mechanism.
- Discussion about the how and what was shaped by the multiprogramme coordination mechanism
- Challenge: different programme project call timelines
- Way forward:
  - More in-depth discussion about the objectives of the joint activities and the intended impact to be carried out, also in a bilateral setting. As a possible impact, the programmes already identified, e.g., improved policy impact in the region, improved governance, more coherent and compatible solutions, and complementarities between CBC and TN programmes addressing the same or similar topics.
  - Next steps to think about the tools needed to implement interprogramme coordination activities, such as, e.g., multiprogramme coordination mechanism

Supporting the development of a multidimensional approach to re-build coastal and maritime tourism in the Western Mediterranean (WestMED)

#### Objectives: Strengthen competitiveness and sustainability of coastal and maritime tourism sectors

- 1. tap into eco-tourism market,

- To design and pilot **eco-smart tourism packages for the school-trip tourism** market, addressed to primary, secondary schools (age groups: 6-10 yrs; 11-13yrs; 14-16yrs),
- With the strong involvement and collaboration of West Mediterranean tourism SMEs, offer "learn-by-visiting"

Consortium: IT, ES, MR, PT, BE/Duration: 28 Months/

Total cost: 995.854 EUR/Grant: 796.683 EUR





#### 2. REBOOT MED PROJECT

- Public-private partnership co-defining Blue Economy Action Plans for the Recovery of the tourism sector
- To **incubate**, **accelerate and test new eco/blue economy tourism packages** in 10 pilot areas in 6 WestMed countries.
- Capacity building and awareness-raising on the competitiveness and sustainability of the coastal and maritime tourism ecosystem -> through local clusters and a series of exchanges organised in collaboration with the WestMed Initiative;
- Promoting asset-based development approach -> support and stimulate tourism
   SMEs, coastal communities and potential pioneers (women, NEETs, startuppers) to play as actors of change in re-imagining and re-building coastal and maritime tourism.
- Targeted go-to-market services and testing activities


