

Why joining forces?

Identifying cross-cutting themes and opportunities for collaboration

IPA-IPA CBC capitalisation

- Capitalisation exercises since 2020
- Capitalisation Network of stakeholders; analyses by CBIB+ team; questionnaires & meetings
- Pool of completed or advanced projects under major priority topics (environment / resources & tourism / culture)
- Clustering of projects -> Assessment by cluster -> Cross-cutting assessment (success factors, good practice examples, etc) -> Conclusions & Lessons learned
- Draft report (ongoing); supplementary assessments (newer projects; specific sub-topics)

Capitalisation of environment projects (1)

- Topic: “Protecting the environment and promoting climate change adaptation and mitigation, risk prevention and management”

- Subtopics covered:
 - Waste and pollution

 - Management of resources and risks:
 - Sustainable management of natural resources

 - Managing natural and man-made threats, risk and disaster management

 - Water management

Capitalisation of environment projects (2)

- Initial pool of c. 100 projects
- 4 clusters: action-focused vs knowledge-focused projects with predominantly remedial vs managerial outcomes
- Status: main report (5th draft) & supplementary report (Sept 2023)

Capitalisation of tourism projects

- Topic: “Encouraging tourism and cultural and natural heritage”
- Initial pool of c. 100 projects
- 5 clusters: area-wide vs targeted (thematically or territorially) projects, focused on tourism offer vs enabling conditions
- Status: main report (3rd draft) & supplementary report on culture projects (in progress)

Cross-cutting themes of major interest (1)

Sustainability:

1. Ongoing operation (in part or whole)
2. Legacy outcomes (agreements, management plans, etc)
3. Continuation of cross-border cooperation between partners

Long-term impact:

1. General: better cross-border neighbourliness
2. Tourism related: improved economic activity, jobs and incomes
3. Environment related: sustainable use of natural resources, effective management of risks/disasters/waste, reduced pollution
4. General (indirect): multiplier effects, integration in multi-project strategy

Cross-cutting themes of major interest (2)

Genuine cross-border projects:

1. “Joint” project (i.e. joint development, financing, staffing, implementation)
2. Project activities substantially conducted on a cross-border basis (not in parallel)
3. Benefits occurring on both sides

Building Synergies



Complementarities and synergies between programmes help to deliver stronger policy impact in the areas, assure better use of resources, enhance programme capacities, help build stronger links between projects for better transfer, scaling up and mainstreaming of results. It also helps to coordinate communication and outreach to stakeholders.



Based on Synergies processes in, e.g., Mediterranean area, interprogramme coordination mechanism on sustainable tourism in Med, Arctic cooperation.

Sharing information accross programmes.

Interact developed a tool allowing automatised data exchange across programmes starting from the application stage called Index. There are currently three pilots implemented, including a cluster of Interreg IPA CBC programmes.







How to make a good cooperation project?	Real needs of target groups are not always addressed
Application process too complex, too tight deadlines	Capacity building support to assessors

Area based hubs – going beyond partner search forums
