Border obstacles

Different types of obstacles ...

- Physical barriers (e.g. mountain ranges, rivers)
- Intangible ones (e.g. mental barriers, culture-language-history, etc.)
- Normative and institutional obstacles (according to various studies in particuar in the fields of labour market, education, taxation)

Collecting solid evidence to assess the needs to be addressed by Interreg cross-border cooperation programmes, Study, DG Regio 2016





[...] legal barriers (especially those related to health services, labour regulation, taxes, business development), and barriers linked to differences in administrative cultures and national legal frameworks, are difficult for the programmes alone to address (as they require decisions beyond programme and project management structures).

If 20% of existing legal and administrative obstacles found along internal borders were addressed, border regions would increase their GDP by 2%.

PEACE

 www.borderpeople.info set up to provide cross-border information for people with cross border lives in the Ireland / Northern Ireland border region. Initially funded by Peace and Interreg funding, however not currently in receipt of any EU funding.

Germany/Brandenburg - Poland

- Cross- border cooperation between Mecklenburg-West Pomerana and West Pomerania in the context of sustainable management for maritime regions
- Joint urban planning for border cities the spatial plans are not coordinated with each other; cross-border management of emergency and health care services – option for reimbursement for treatments on the other side of the border; police cooperation - language barriers in communication, incompatible technical equipment

Austria - Bavaria

 Cross-border public transport; renewable energy projects; ambulant therapeutic services

Italy - France (maritime)

 Project "– E-JOB_Excellence Job on board; project tackling administrative constraints for students from IT and FR related to internships on board of yachts

 Focus under ISO 1; governance approach identifiying and prioritising border obstacles in close cooperation between programme partner regions and EGTC European Region Tyrol - South Tyrol – Trentino

• Cross border mobility, management of waterways, management of public services and public utilities such as swimming pools, etc.



Registration: Examples - 3/3

Central Europe

- SUSTANCE (www.interreg-central.eu/sustance) aiming to solve the lack of efficient and sustainable public transport solutions in peripheral and crossborder areas of Central Europe;
- Central Mountains (www.central-europe.eu/centralmountains) aiming at strengthening governance models in the Alpine-Carpathian mountain areas of Central Europe, with a particular focus on cross-border and transnational structures for cooperation;
- TRANSTRITIA dealing with multi-modal logistic in the TRITIA area, it has developed some cross-border action plans for freight transport
- TRANSBORDERS Improving accessibility from peripheral cross-border areas to the TEN-T core network, they had pilots on e.g. a new cross-border bus and a rail connection


