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



Explore the applications of lean reporting, monitoring & change management and the ways to simplify project implementation



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
A new reporting approach



Traditional Reporting

Why this change?

- Reduction of administrative burden
- Targeted reporting focusing on results and on supporting beneficiaries
- No possibility for programme to pre-finance the projects
- Quicker reimbursement



Checklist of project progress

Overall assessment (chose only one)

- PROJECT ON TRACK
- PROJECT WITH MINOR PROBLEMS
- PROJECT WITH SIGNIFICANT PROBLEMS

Findings

Summarize all above findings divided per project partner.

Recommendations

Each finding requires recommendation for further proceeding, including undertaking of corrective actions, submission of clarifications, additional evidences and documents.

By exception, some findings require no specific recommendations, including:

- minor changes/problems with no financial impact on the project implementation, which are well justified and acceptable;
- problems with financial impact, which require submission of irregularity signal and no further action by the PPs.

All recommendations should be divided per project partner and include clear deadline for answer (between 3 to 10 days).

Reporting of project progress – advanced level

Flexibility rules

- Project duration
- Budget / Cost categories
- Work plan
- Output and Result indicators

Project changes

- Amendment of the application form:
 - Partnership / Project duration / Budget
- Set up of procedures:
 - o Templates to fill-in / Bodies involved / Time to Approval

Contract amendments

- Required for every project change / only for specific project changes
- No amendment of Co-financing contract required
- Electronic signature used / not used



Doing data collection in a structured and lean way can; save time help spot best practices and showcase them easily help identify problems early at project level monitor programme progress in a structured way help compare projects and even programme achievements help showcase progress towards reaching programme targets make reporting to the commission easier
