


### Association of European Border Regions (AEBR)

#### We represent **border regions** to:

- highlight the **role** of border regions in the political landscape;
- represent their common interests;
- enhance cooperation between border regions throughout Europe;
- promote exchanges of experiences, information and solutions to common obstacles

Founded in 1971 by the first border regions to embark on cross-border cooperation in Europe

Today: about 100 members from EU member states and neighbouring countries











### What is *b-solutions*?



Launched by EU Commission's DG REGIO

Managed by AEBR

Addresses legal and administrative obstacles hindering cross-border cooperation in the EU









### What is *b-solutions'* objective?



**Support** local actors in border regions

to solve obstacles

of a legal and/or administrative nature

along EU borders, inclusive along borders with EFTA and **IPA** countries

#### Because:

- 40 land borders between the 27 EU Member States, the EFTA countries and the UK
- 448 regions (NUTS 3 level) located alongside at least one border;
- 30% of Europeans live in these regions

#### Obstacle:

Different regulatory **requirements** for the recognition of **diploma** and **internship** conditions in Italy and France blocked the completion of the Interreg project "E-JOB" – Excellence Job on Board


A b-solutions' case by Province of Lucca (Regional Contact Point of Interreg Marittimo)

#### Support included:

- Discussions with representatives of the schools involved in Italy and in France
- Analysis of legal framework to establish a dual diploma to recognise skills across the border
- Concrete suggestions to harmonise common rules and trainings

Actions taken to solve the obstacles:

Launch of the project 'I-YEP' under the Interreg programme Italy-France Maritime!

## b-solutions 2.0: A call for proposals to support solutions

Goal: identify and promote further 120 cases and sustainable methods of resolving border obstacles of a legal and/or administrative nature

Target: Public bodies in border regions (including public equivalent bodies); and Cross-border structures (EGTCs, Euroregions)

Scope: border regions along EU internal **land and maritime borders** and along EU borders with EFTA and IPA countries

Themes: institutional cooperation, public services, labour markets and education and European Green Deal










### Which kind of border obstacles do we look at?

Legal and administrative obstacles which arise because of:

- lack of coherence of legislation applicable on the different sides of the border
- inconsistencies, non-existence, or overlapping of different administrative procedures
- applicable European, national or regional legislation or administrative procedures do not take into account the specificity of cross-border interaction













### Which kind of support is provided?

*b-solutions* provides technical support

- > Participants receive advice by legal experts who cooperate with them to:
- define the obstacle;
- identify a possible solution to it.

#### **Output:**

Report by the expert with clear explanation of the obstacle and suggestions for concrete solutions











### How does it work?



Through field visits, experts carry out the analysis.

Experts are assigned to participants for 9 days within a period of a maximum of 3 months.

Costs and administration are managed by AEBR.

The expert writes a report about the obstacle and suggests solutions to overcome it.

### **Timeline**

**Deadline**: As long as the are resources available

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis with immediate implementation.









### What do you obtain from *b-solutions?*

- A full report with a detailed analysis of the specific obstacle faced in the region, and proposals for concrete solutions
- Participation in a compendium illustrating a variety of obstacles and possible solutions to enhance crossborder cooperation








### How do Interreg and *b-solutions* complete each other?

Interreg as the financing instrument for ETC has had an enormous impact on CBC in Europe, BUT border obstacles persist and affect many aspects of life in border regions such as:



- access to public services: offer of public transport, reimbursement of healthcare costs;
- access to the labour market: administrative burdens, slow recognition, limitation to working remotely;
- management of common resources or natural **areas** (parks, rivers, etc.): lack of governance, incompatible regulations on the protection of biodiversity or on the sharing of energy.









### **b-solutions** for Interreg

It increases the effectiveness of Interreg:

providing expert support analysis to follow up on the implementation of Interreg projects that stalled because of legal and/or administrative obstacles

It expands the potential of Interreg:

Offering a first step towards approaching legal and administrative obstacles to cross-border cooperation which can be developed as Interreg projects under ISO 1

It supports regional development and promotes cooperation:

removing 1/5 of border obstacles could lead to GDP +2% in border regions and 1 million new jobs and promoting European integration

<ul> <li>Regional and local levels do not have legislative competence to set up or operate services</li> <li>Laws do not provide for automatic recognition of foreign diplomas of service professionals</li> <li>The presence of different national rules that regulate services</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Lengthy diploma recognition procedures</li> <li>Absence of joint administrative mechanisms that facilitate the operation of services</li> <li>Lack of knowledge of border stakeholders about facilitative legal frameworks regulating certain services</li> </ul>












### What have we learned so far?

- Legal and administrative obstacles are many and different, as are their root causes
- There are no off-the-shelf solutions! Solutions must be tailored to the specificities of the territories involved – every region, every country is different
- Solutions can involve several options:
  - Change in legal frameworks
  - Harmonise administrative practices
  - Use of complementary tools such as INTERREG, EGTC
- It is important to have:
  - Deep analysis
  - Political commitment
  - Information sharing
  - Multi-level engagement
  - Capacity building











"There are two major outcomes: one, for the specific border, we get the solution for the specific case – and this may be a game-changer. Secondly, from a macroperspective, looking at the whole Europe, we get knowledge on obstacles – and this helps us shape policies"
