

Originally KEEP, Knowledge and Expertise in European Programmes.


Set up by Interact in 2009, in consultation with Interreg programmes and the European Commission. First online in 2011.





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
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Keep.eu's challenges are those of a knowledge-management tool

Challenges of data integrity

- Accessibility. (Are the data easily available?)
- **Completeness.** (Are the data complete? Are critical data fields populated?)
- Correctness. (Are formats as expected? Is the format consistent?)
- **Timeliness.** (Are the data updated, timely delivered, compared and aggregated?)
- **Synchronisation.** (Do proper links exist? Are data relationships consistent?)
- **Usage.** (Are data effectively used and relevant?)



Interact: Why keep.eu?

- **Policy objective (Interreg -specific):** PO6. A better cooperation governance
- **Specific objective:** ISO6.1. Enhance the institutional capacity of public authorities, in particular those mandated to manage a specific territory, and of stakeholders. **Three priorities:**
- **P1: Increasing efficiency:** Strengthening the management capacity of Interreg programmes and other cooperation actors.
- **P2: Enabling individuals:** Strengthening the capacity to work in cooperation programmes and context.
- **P3: Interreg visibility:** Strengthening the capacity to capture and communicate programme and project results and to increase visibility.


How does Interact collect Interreg's 2021-2027 project-partner data?

Programme by programme:

- Programmes send data (json and xml) to keep.eu through a plugin in Jems.
- Programmes export data from their MSs (e.g. to Excel), email to keep.eu.
- Programmes set up automatic exports (xml) from their MSs and send data at specific intervals to keep.eu (namely by FTP).
- Team working with keep.eu collects limited sets of data from programmes' websites.

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A very Interreg dillema

Programmes work on a defined programme, on a defined territory

BUT are asked to find and act on cross-programme synergies

Programmes are asked to select the best projects, and to avoid funding already existing initiatives or projects

BUT are not able to fully see which projects already exist or are about to be funded by other programmes

Programmes are asked to ensure that all regions in their territory are participating

BUT cannot fully see the wider picture and fund concentration across a larger region



What if...

programmes could know what projects and partners their neighbours are funding?



Why in 2021-2027 period?

Harmonisation of data fields

IT maturity of programmes and use of e-monitoring systems

Experience with co-creation and service design



Other Considerations

Main principles

- Automation: limited to no additional workload for programmes
- Fact-based cross-programme cooperation initiatives
- Already from the assessment stage
- Works with data that is not public

Flexible in defining user cases

- To identify synergies and build on these
- To ensure Value for Money and realise greater gains for the regions with less funding
- ...


